It's No Blarney. Irish TV Scene Lacking

The Dublin metropolitan area has nearly 1 million people, yet there is only one gay bar and disco. There used to be two gay bars, one of which admitted CEOs, TVs, etc., and the other didn't even like lesbians! The friendly one changed hands about 18 months ago. It supposed to be a "gay friendly" but straight bar. Most of the gay patrons remained and had no problem. After I had been there a few times I was refused entry. When I asked why, I was told, "We don't want your type here." Now, I took this personally and asked the manager what I had done. She admitted I'd done nothing but repeated, "We don't want your type here." I assumed she was objecting to crossdressing which didn't make sense because she likes to have drag acts! Anyway, I got my own back and told all the gay community – most of whom frequented the place. The bar is now closed again and reopening, they hope, as a straight bar. They'll be lucky.

In the meantime, we had a strike of luck. Two things happened. First, a gay friend approached the owner of the George (the second bar, and made a very strong case that I and my friends should be allowed to use the premises. He agreed. Sometime later, the manager, who was the one with the anti-semitic attitude was sacked and the new manager is more than glad to have us.

Crossdressers in Ireland fall into two broad categories – those who are simply crossdressers and those who are transsexuals. This is a distinction I saw in one of the "alt" newsgroups where a crossdresser is defined as somebody whose dressing form comes from the clothes and not from her inner femininity. I apologise to any one offended by this remark. It is intended simply to define someone of liberal attitude in an Irish context and not to discuss on body.

The majority of the crossdressers here belong to a group called the Friends of Eve which is an offshoot of the English Boudoir Society, in turn an offshoot of Virginia Prince's old PFDU (Dulles). The "Friends" are completely homophobic and this has generated considerable friction between them and the transsexual population. There is no corresponding organisation for transsexuals as it has been found that they are either in the closet, in which

case they won't join an organisation, or out, in which case they don't need an organisation.

The only place we have to socialise in Dublin is the George bar, unless you are really posh, then there are plenty of places to go because nobody reads you anyway.

Because of this lack of social locations, a number of people have jumped in to provide what they call "dressing facilities." These, for a long time, can be devised for a period of time. Unfortunately, with our exception, these places are always down where the management is only interested in taking your money. I have researched them all. Some are simply brothels or massage parlours while others are a step closer, but have a number of sexual activities including discipline and infantilism. Not what the regular crossdresser wants.

I am involved in running a help line for crossdressers of all sorts. This operates one night a week and, while most of its business is done by phone, we are always willing to meet a distressed crossdresser for a one to one meeting. In addition, we will talk to relatives of a crossdresser in an non-judgmental way. Our advice is always non-directive so we have gained a degree of respect among health care workers and the media. The problem with this line, as with all others of its kind, is staffing. It is hard to open your heart to others when your own heart may be bleeding.

I'm afraid that the scene in a small country such as Ireland gets uncertain, so we need feedback from the world. I find the best thing that ever happened to me was getting onto the Internet. I've been reading the soc support transgendered and alt transgendered newsgroups, but there is very little of help to them so rarely they seem to be a couple of individuals scoring points off each other.

We are trying to make some positive changes and recently had a meeting to organise something more than the annual strip we have at the moment. I had been getting bummed as a result of trying to run the help line singlehanded. Then Michele came along and she had a number of good ideas, but the problem was even two of us couldn't manage. We need some sort of organisation, and obviously some

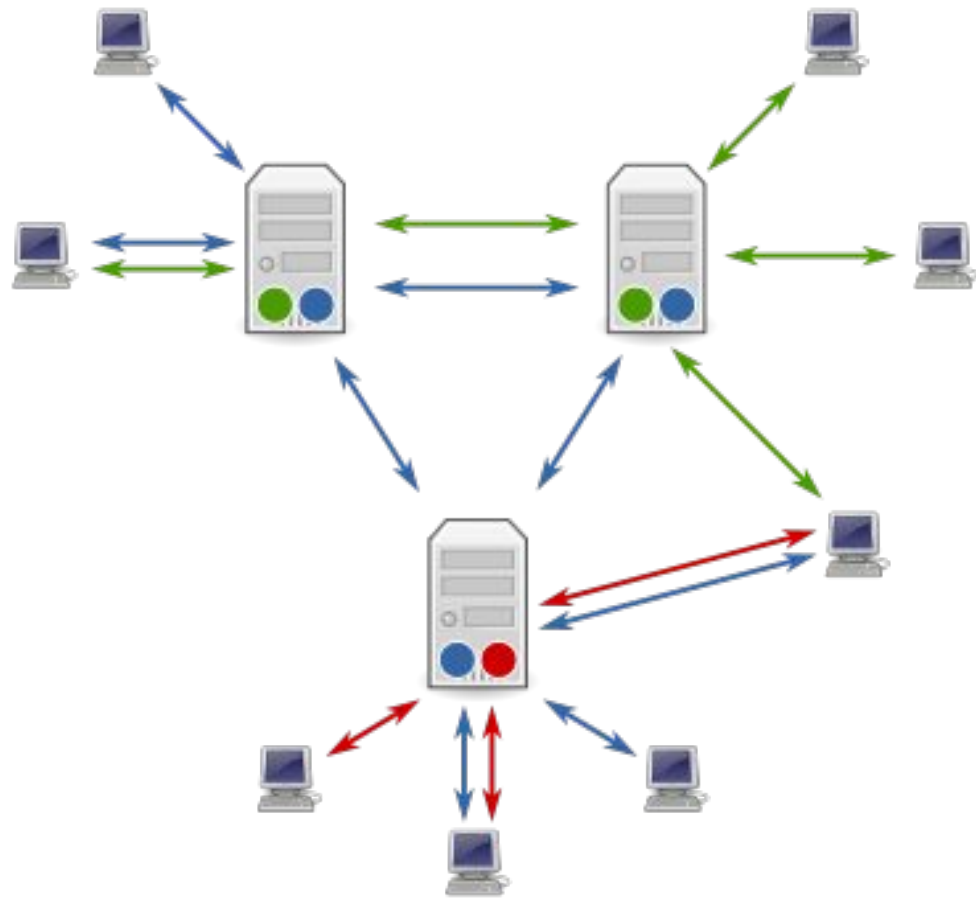

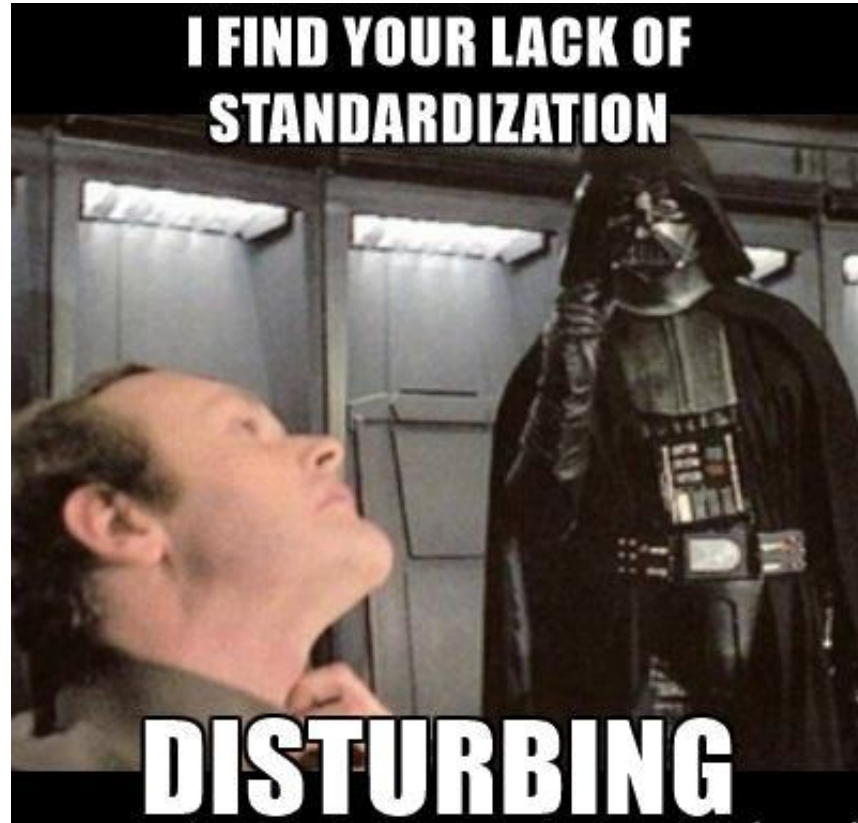

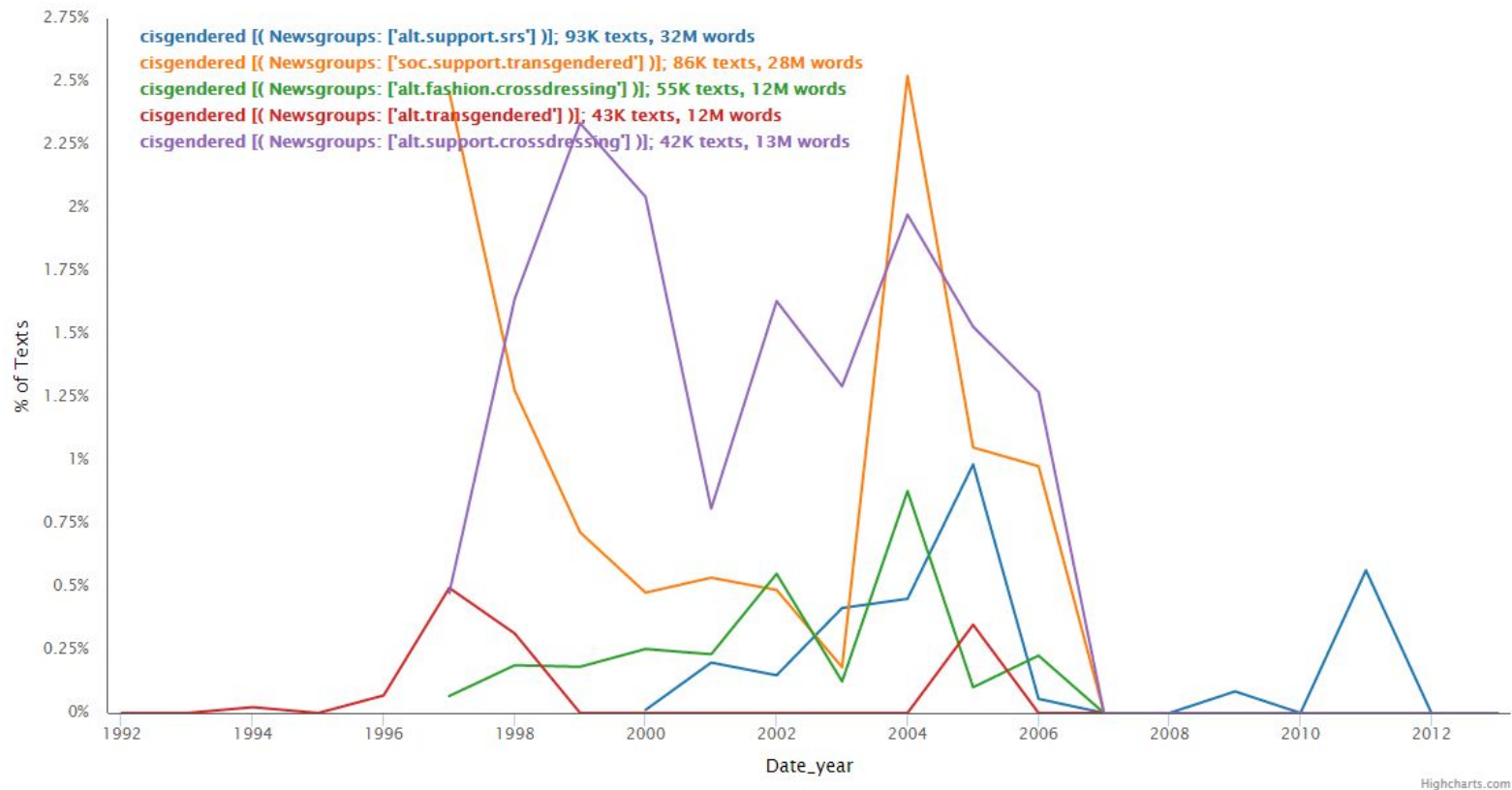

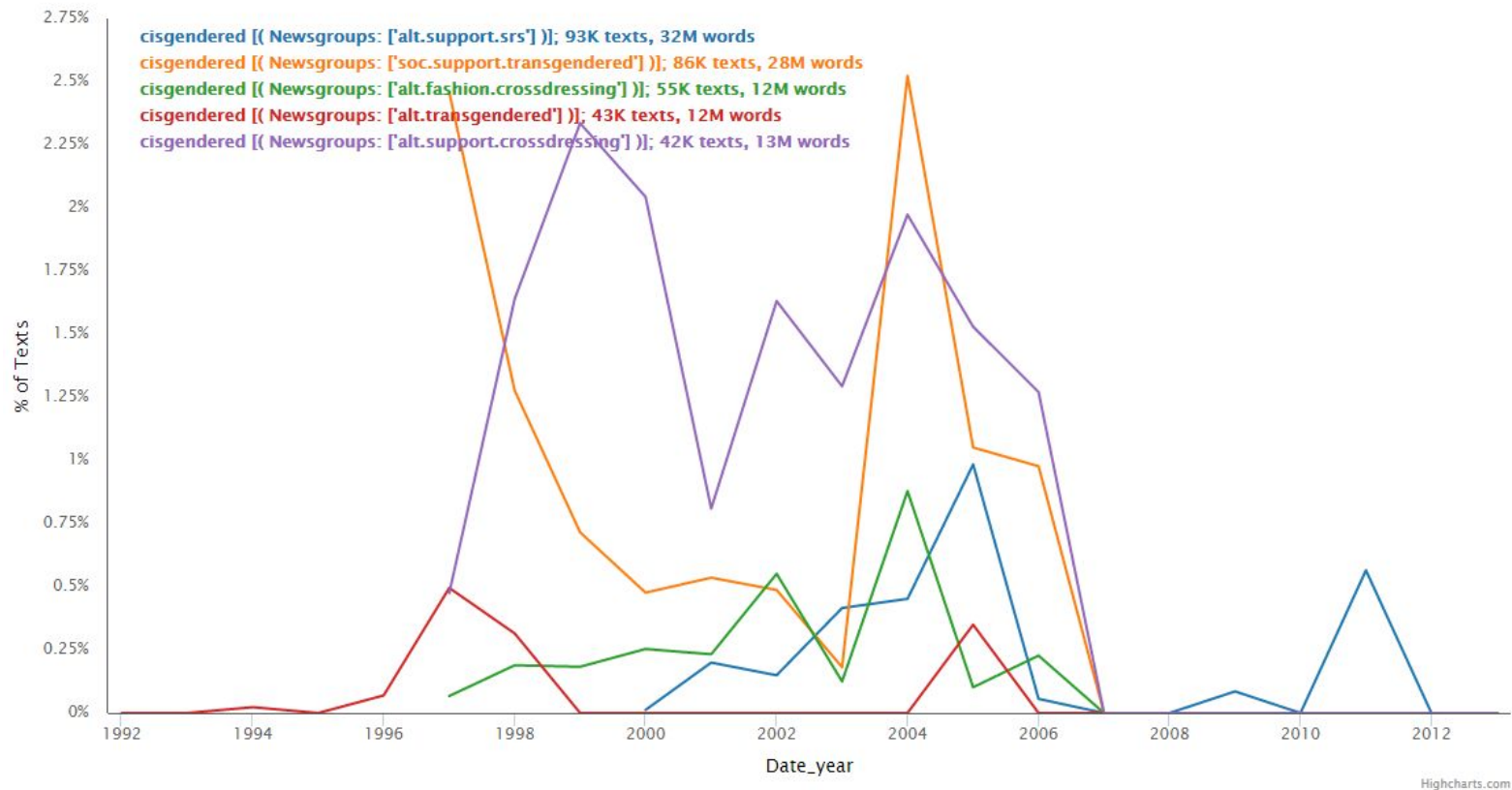
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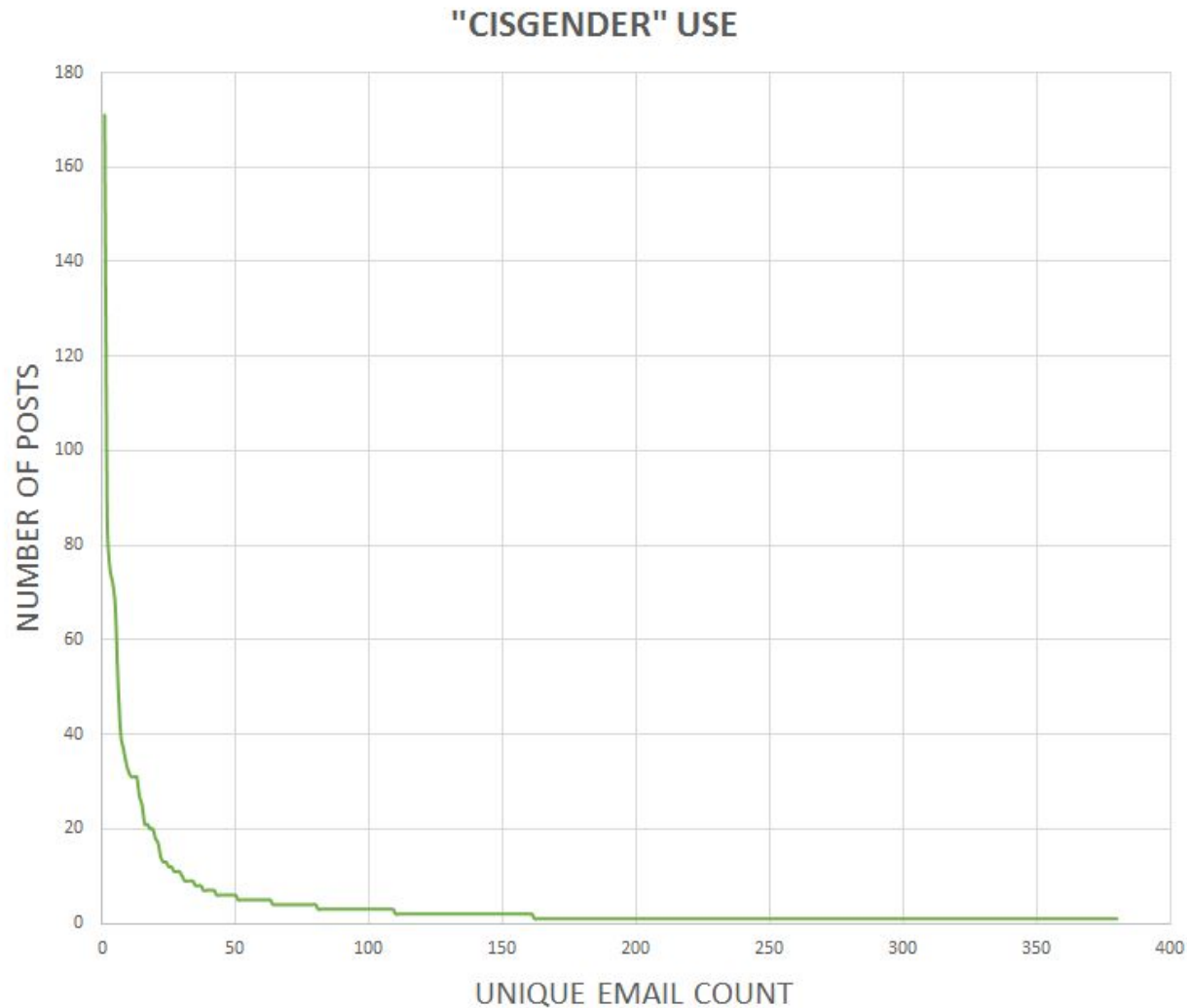

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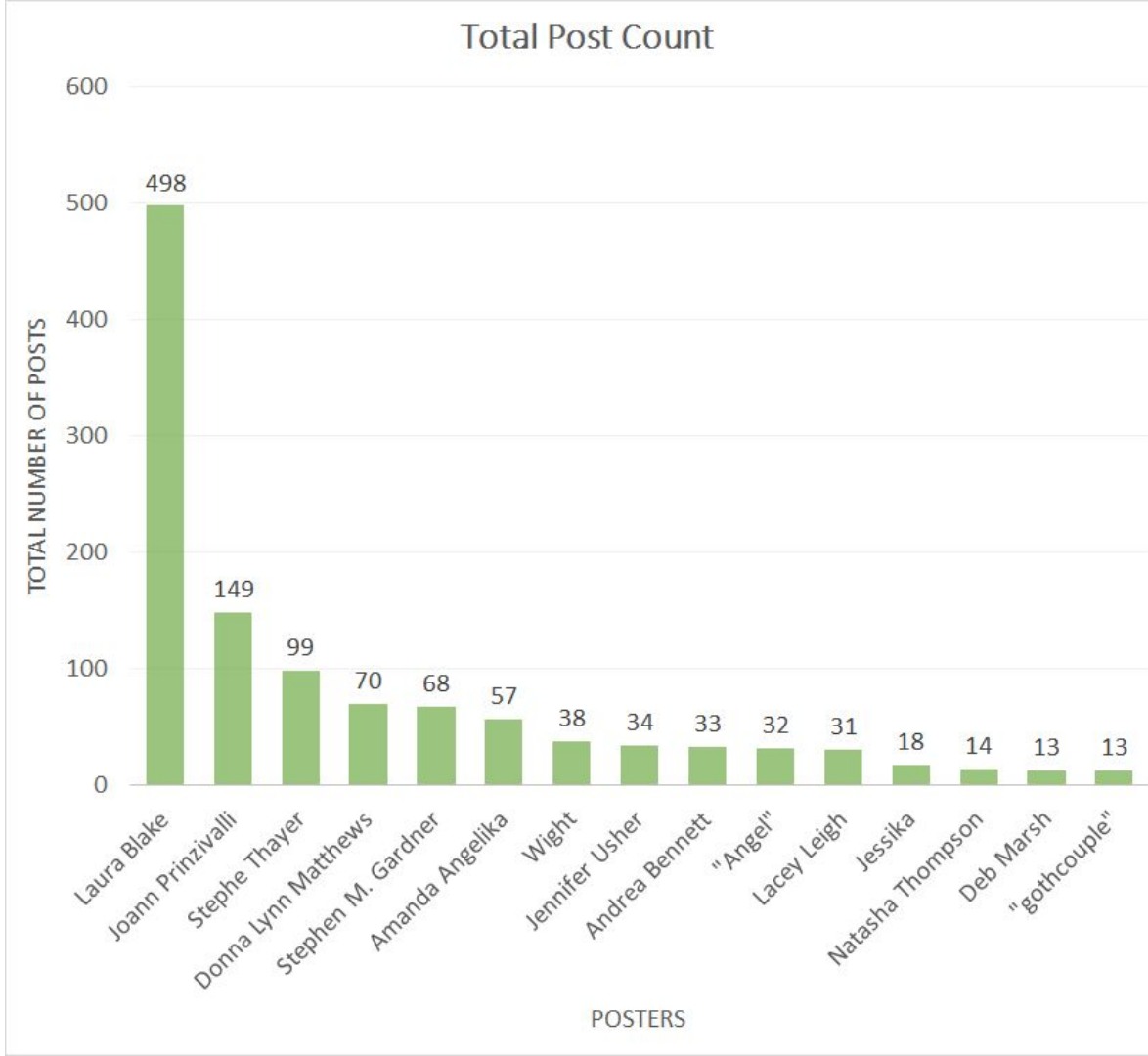


Percent of posts using “cisgendered”

Of the TG newsgroups that exist, (not including Trans-porn groups), only one has not been overrun with **petty bickering and feuds**, and that one group is slowly becoming a porn group. on alt.support.srs and soc.support.transgendered especially, **honest advice and support has become difficult to find**, because **a group of about 5 people spam the groups with constant disparaging remarks and flames, and will not cease doing so**. alt.support.transpeople would hopefully be an escape from such petty useless bickering, and be the supportive environment the others used to be.

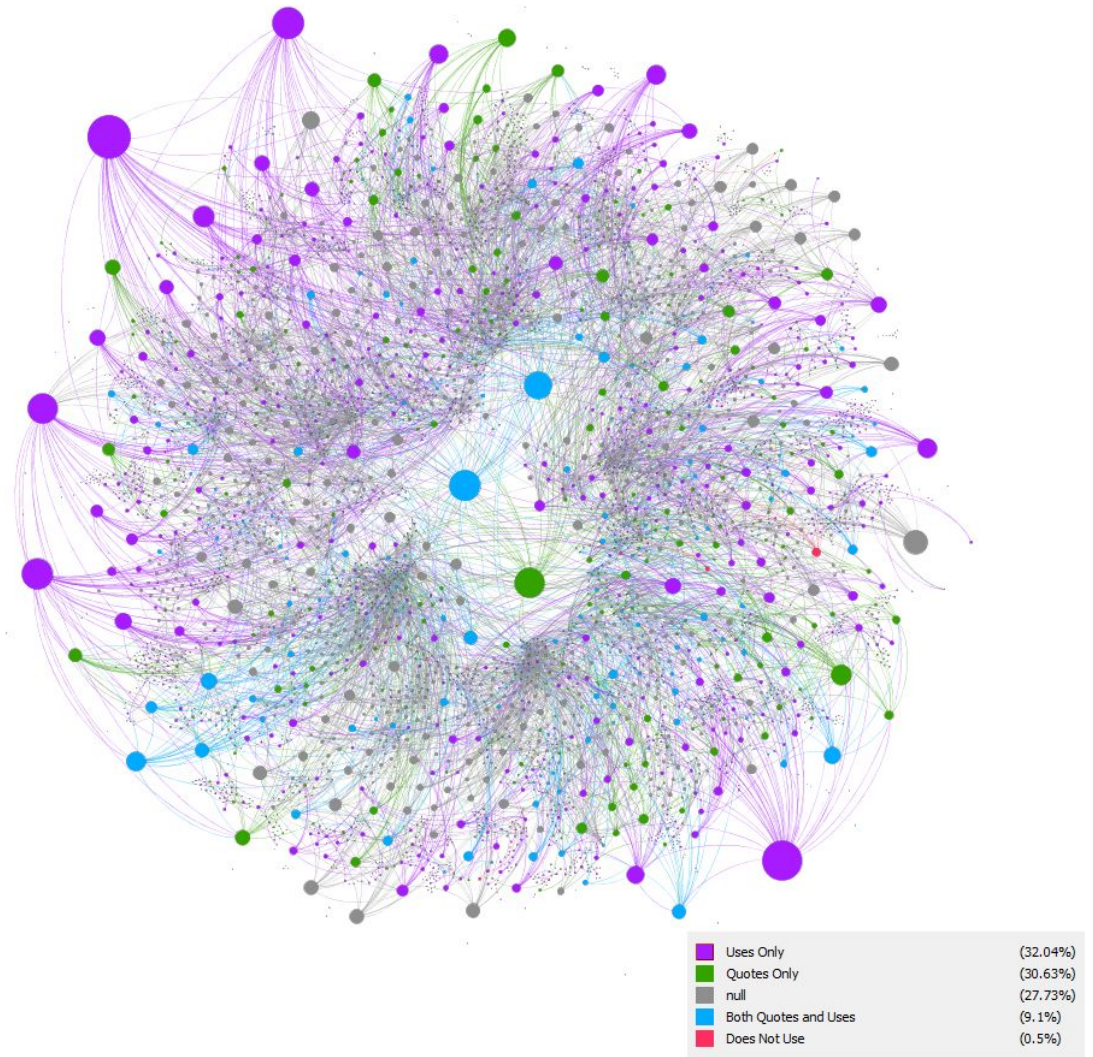

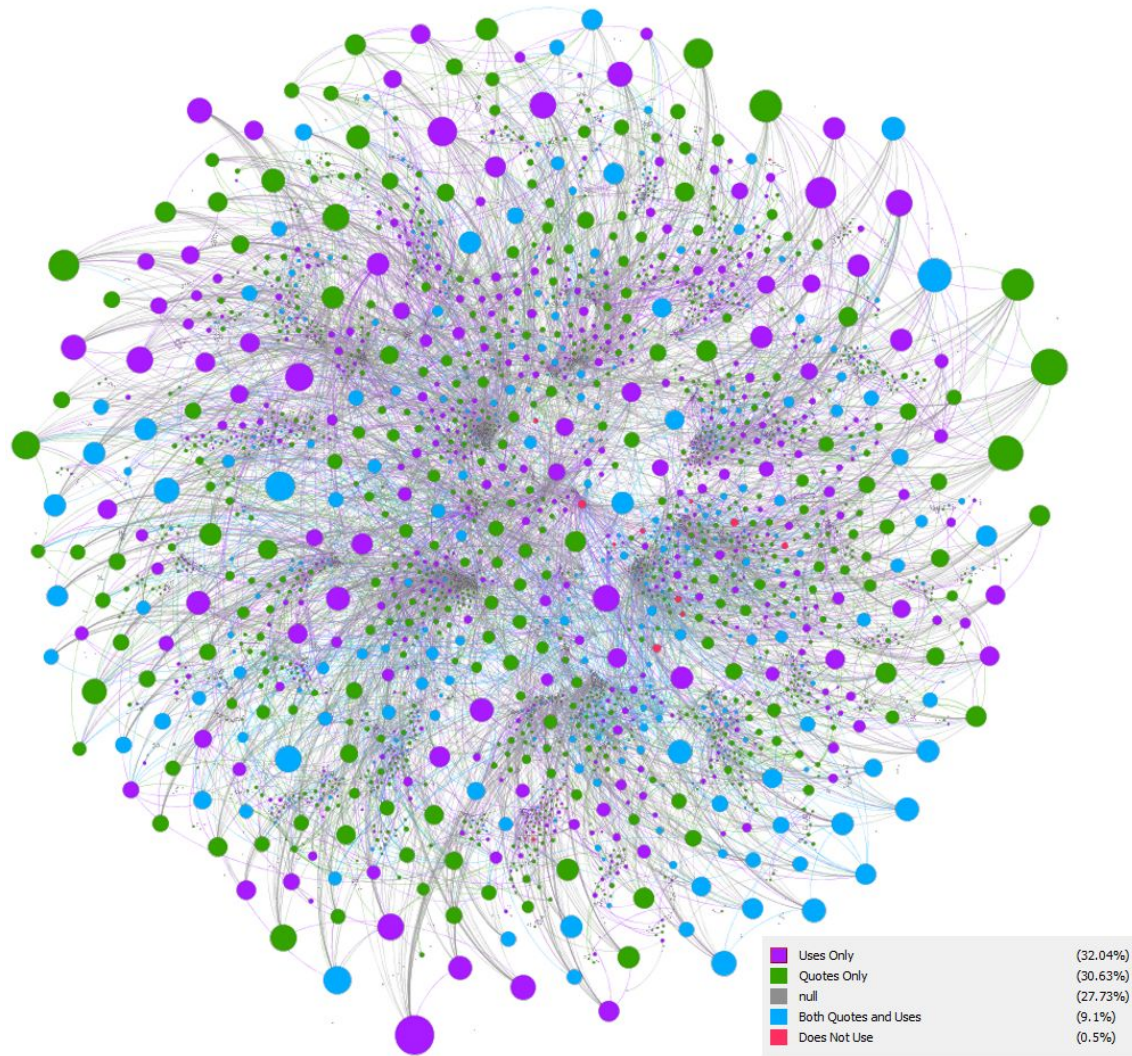

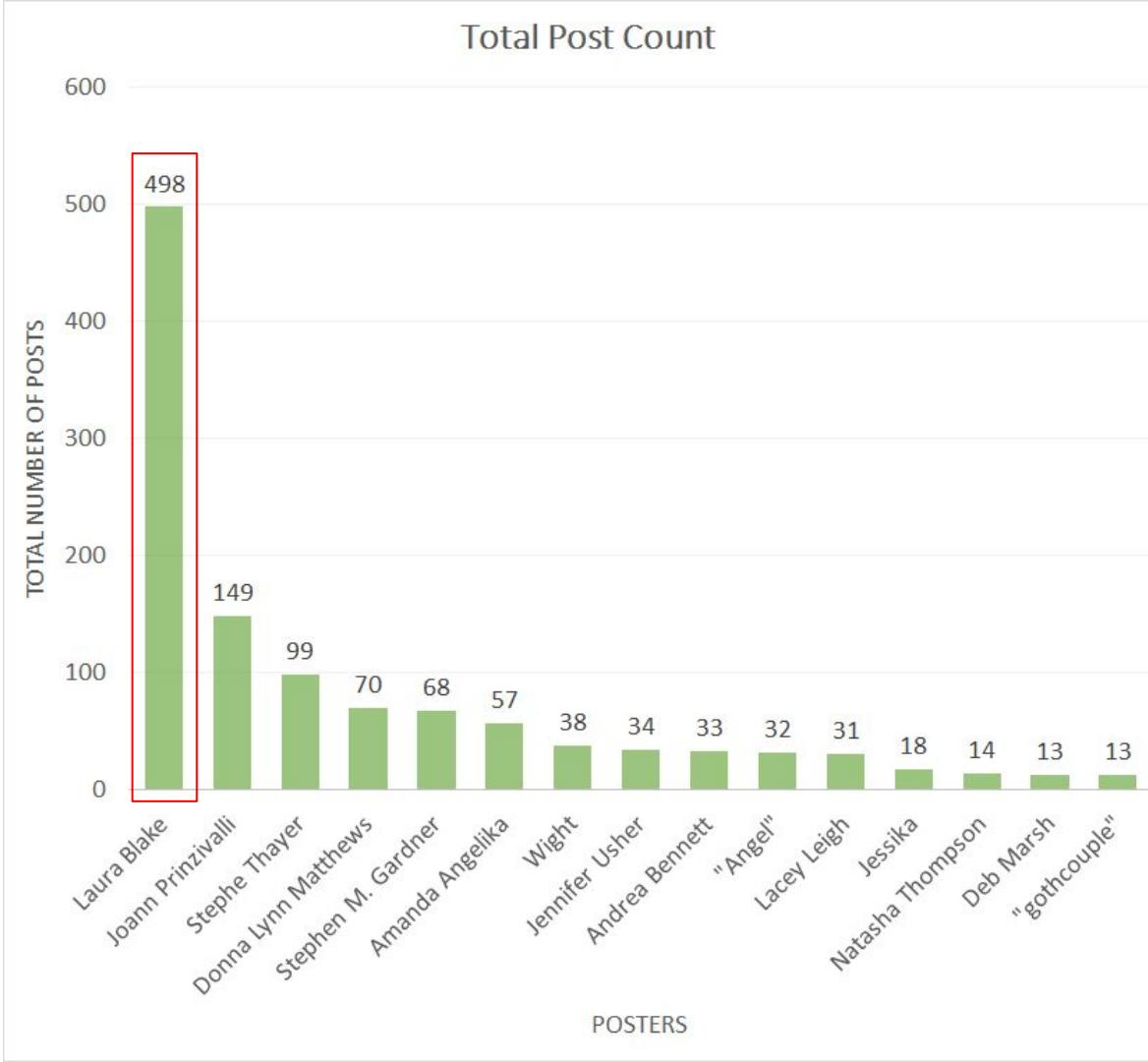
Network of posts with

“Carl Buijs once made a simple comment ‘How come there's no name for people who are not transgendered?’ and offered us the word ‘Cisgendered’... this **profoundly clarified our relationship to the rest of the world** and resulted in a change in my thinking that has allowed me to tackle **many previously unfathomable problems.**”

Laura Blake on Buijs’s creation of “cisgender” (2000)

This is the widely held notion that everyone is Cisgendered and those who are not should be. It is [the] mistaken belief that Transgender is an invalid state --one created by failure or disorder-- that needs to be fixed. The Cisgender Ideal can most easily be summarized by 4 simple rules.

The Cisgender Rules:

- Everyone is Cisgendered by default.

- It is wrong to be anything but Cisgendered.

- Those who are not Cisgendered must appear Cisgendered.

- Those who do not appear Cisgendered are beneath consideration.

You don't have to be a rocket scientist to figure out how much trouble the Cisgender Ideal has caused transgendered people, over the last couple of centuries. These rules actually describe transphobia.

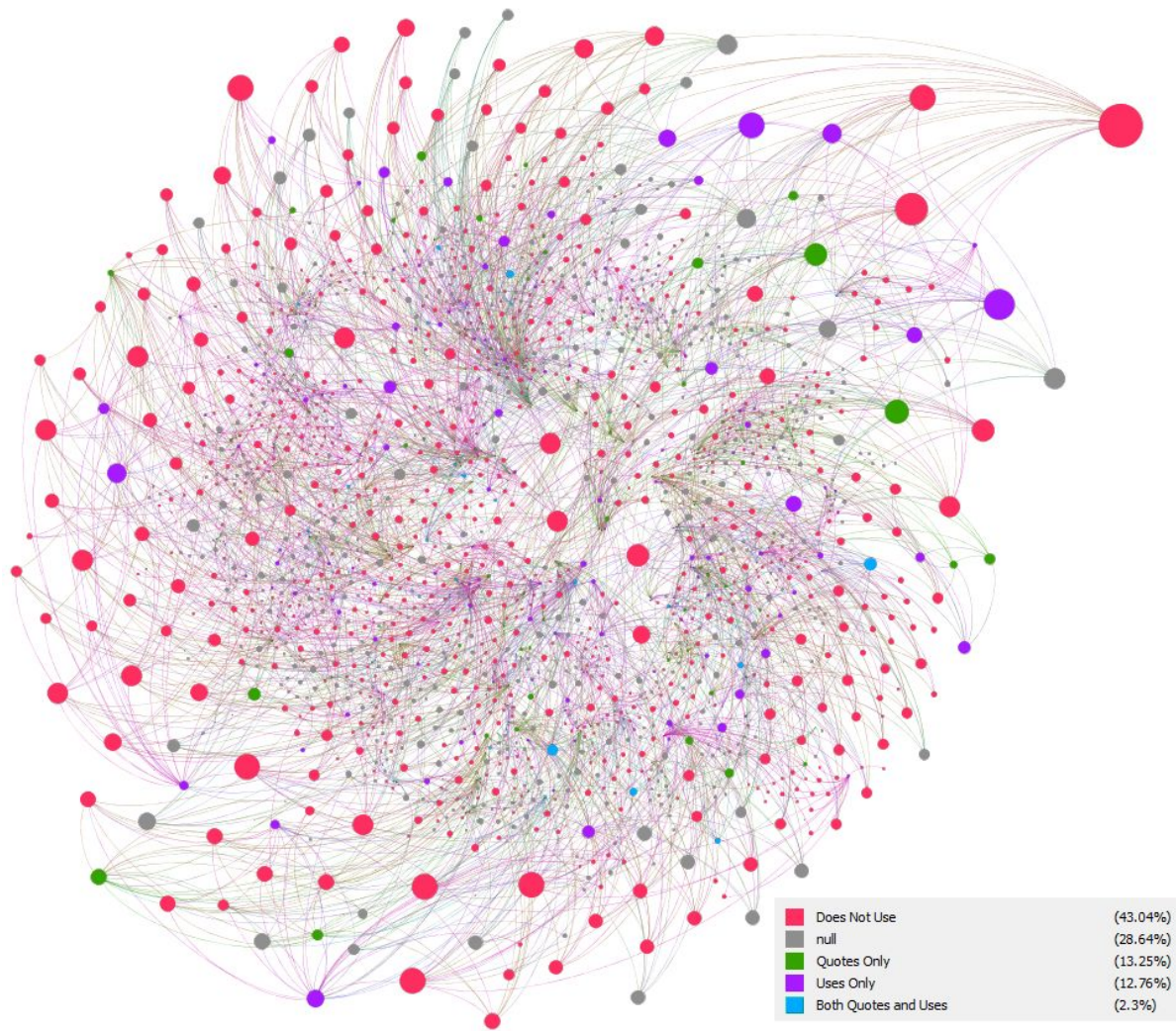
Laura Blake's definition of "Cisgender Ideal"

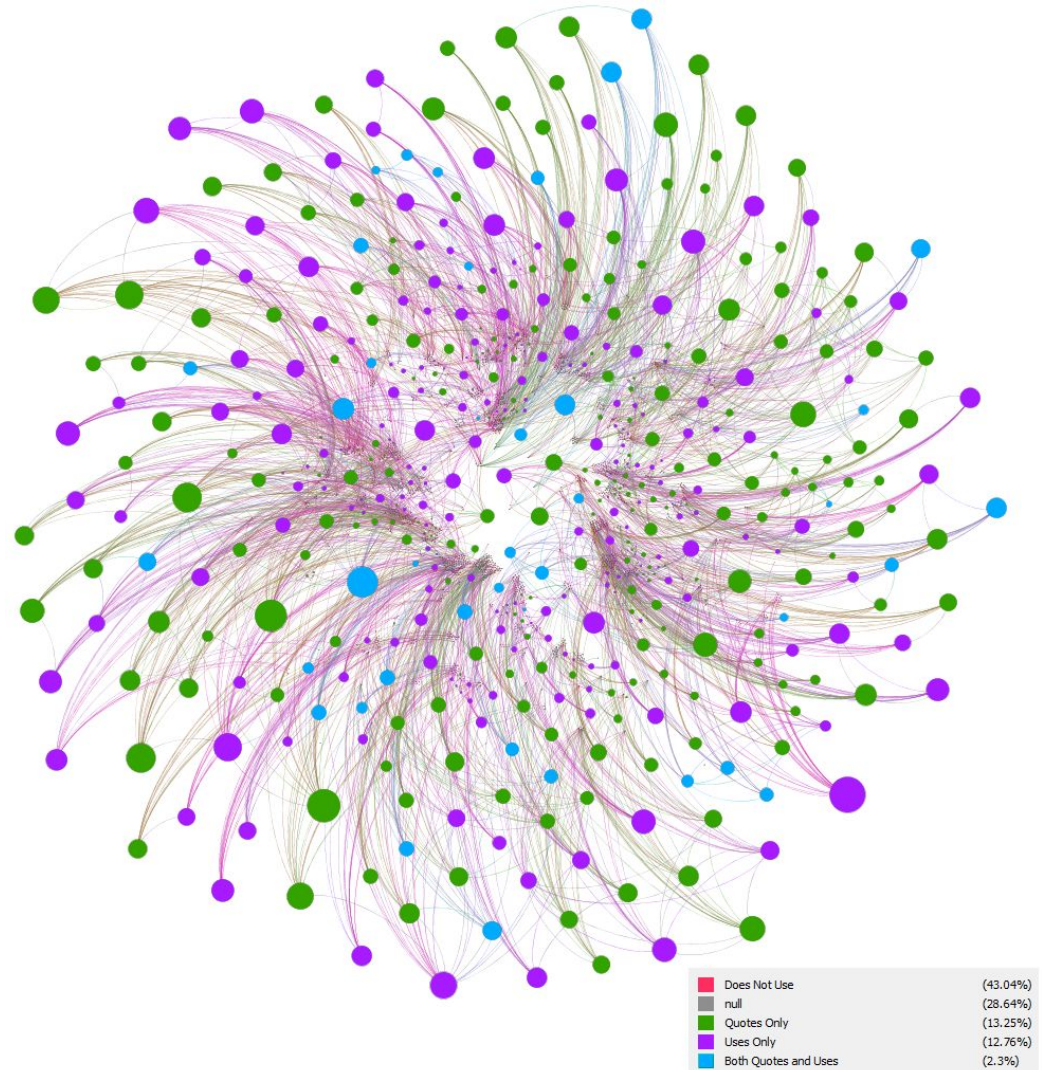

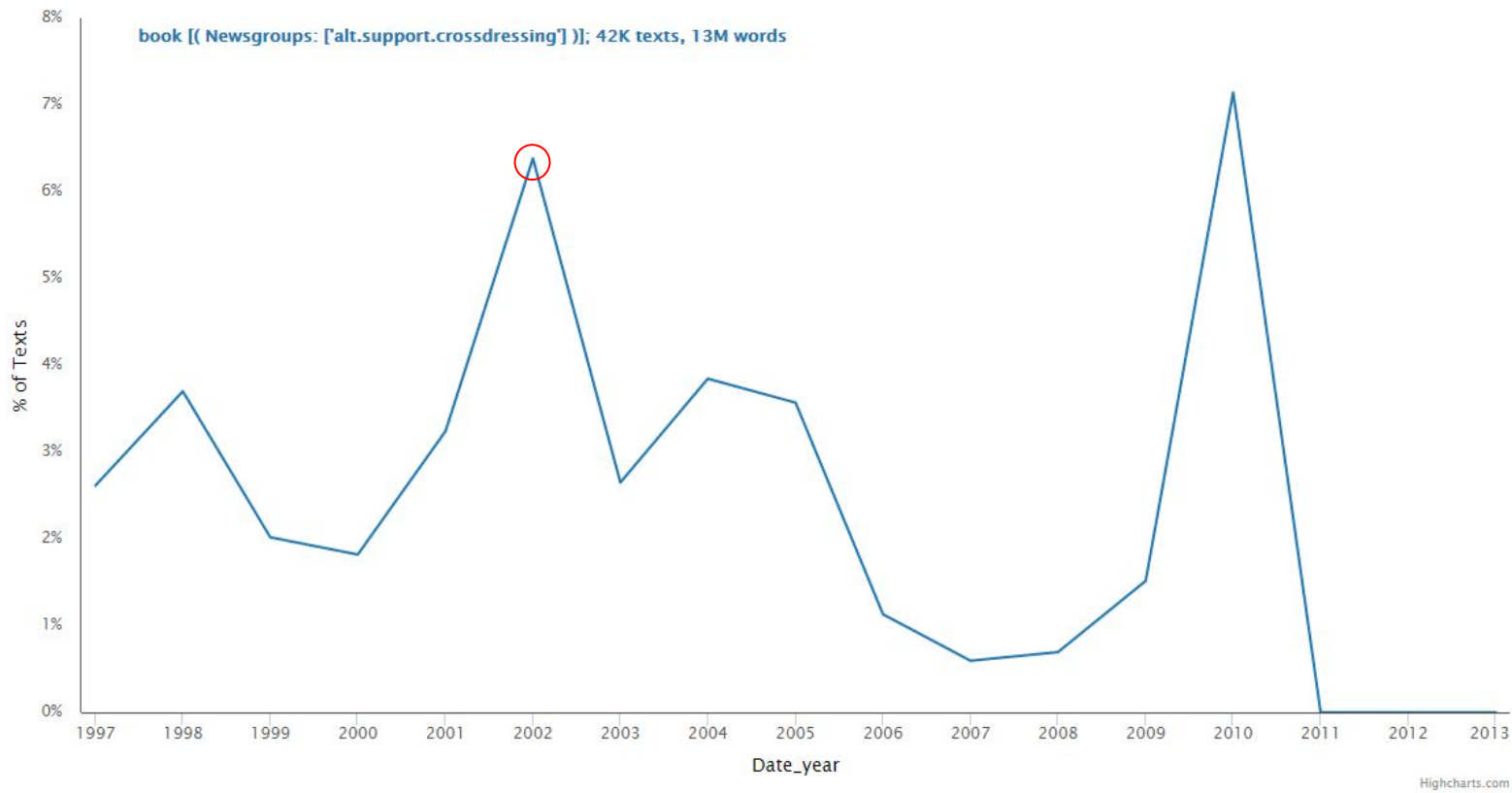

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Cisgender

Cisgender (often abbreviated to simply **cis**) is a term for people whose [gender identity](#) matches the [sex](#) that they were assigned at birth. *Cisgender* may also be defined as those who have "a gender identity or perform a gender role society considers appropriate for one's sex".^[1] It is the opposite of the term *transgender*.^[2]

Etymology and terminology

German [sexologist](#) [Volkmar Sigusch](#) used the [neologism](#) *cissexual* (*zissexuell* in German) in a peer-reviewed publication. In his 1998 essay "The Neosexual Revolution", he cites his two-part 1991 article "Die Transsexuellen und unser nosomorpher Blick" ("Transsexuals and our nosomorphic view") as the origin of the term.^[3] He also used the term in the title of a 1995 article, "Transsexueller Wunsch und zissexuelle Abwehr" (or: "Transsexual desire and cissexual defense").^[4]

Cisgender has its origin in the [Latin](#)-derived prefix *cis-*, meaning "on this side of", which means the opposite of *trans-*, meaning "across from" or "on the other side of". This usage can be seen in the [cis–trans distinction](#) in chemistry, the [cis–trans](#) or [complementation test](#) in genetics, in [Ciscaucasia](#) (from the Russian perspective), and in the ancient Roman term [Cisalpine Gaul](#) (i.e., "Gaul on this side of the Alps"). In the case of gender, *cis-* describes the alignment of gender identity with assigned sex.^[5]

Sociologists [Kristen Schilt](#) and [Laurel Westbrook](#) define *cisgender* as a label for "individuals who have a match between the gender they were assigned at birth, their bodies, and their personal identity".^[2] A number of derivatives of the terms *cisgender* and *cissexual* include *cis male* for "male assigned male at birth", *cis female* for "female assigned female at birth", analogously *cis man*

Since several people emailed me to inquire about the words "cissexual" and "cissexism," I thought I'd make a public clarification.

"Cis-" is a prefix for "on this side of" rooted in Latin. Common words that use this prefix include:

cislunar (situated between the earth and the moon)
cisatlantic (situated on this side of the Atlantic Ocean)
cisoriental (situated on this side of the mountains)

There are also many scientific words that use the prefix "cis-" in its second definition, which is "having a pair of identical atoms or groups on the same side of a plane that passes through two carbon atoms linked by a double bond." [all definitions are taken from American Heritage Dictionary on my computer].

According to Donna Lynn Matthews, the term "cisgender" was first coined by Carl Buhr, a transsexual man, in 1995 (source: http://cydathra.com/mis_donna/ig_def.html). "Cissexual" probably came from that, in reference to "transgender" vs. "transsexual." You might want to search for the terms "cissexual" and "cisgender" on the web to find their actual usage.

The term Cisgender was coined in 1995 by Carl Buijs, a *female-to-male* transsexual from the Netherlands.

As we defined [gender](#) above to mean "the behavioral, cultural, or psychological traits typically associated with one sex", Cisgendered literally means: on this side of the behavioral, cultural, or psychological traits typically associated with one sex.

Stated simply, **it means that one's identity and presentation *matches* their physical morphology.**
